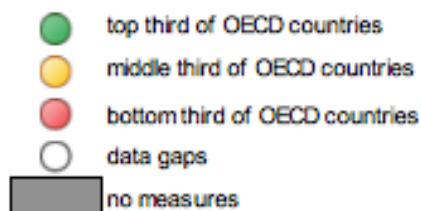

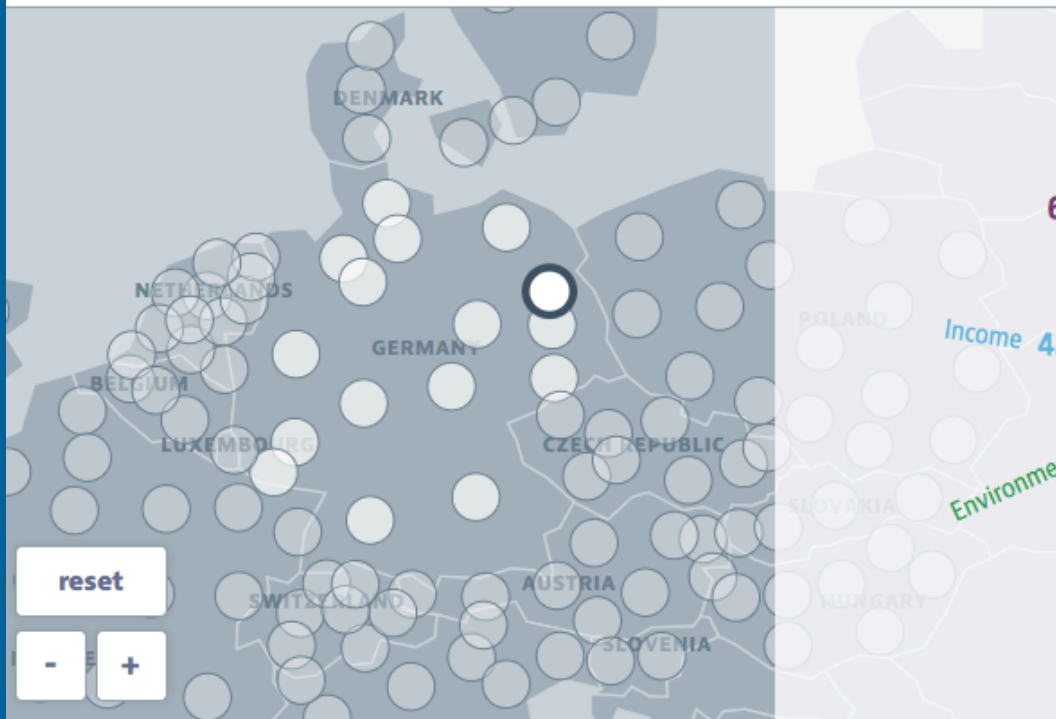

DATA SOURCES



Administrative records

- Very reliable for programme and policy evaluation
- Data not always in line with research question
- Privacy and availability issues



Census and survey data

- Representative
- Costly
- Limited validity in some cases



Panel Data

- Representative
- More accurate for developments over time
- Costly



New data sources

- Sensor data
- Big data applications
- Sentment analysis
